The Albert Schweitzer Fellowship Houston-Galveston (ASFHG) is one of ten Schweitzer programs across the U.S. dedicated to developing a corps of leaders with the skills, network, and confidence to address unmet health needs in underserved communities.

Through mentored direct service and a multidisciplinary leadership development program, ASFHG is building community capacity and training a professional workforce that is skilled in addressing the underlying causes of health inequities and committed to improving health outcomes. Fellows are graduate and undergraduate students competitively selected from member Consortium Schools and come from numerous health-allied fields including, but not limited to, medicine, nursing, public health, pharmacy, social work, and dentistry.

Each year ASFHG receives hundreds of applications. After a careful selection process, new Fellows create sustainable projects that improve the health of marginalized communities in collaboration with community partner agencies. Due to a high demand, we have up to five students interested in each available Fellowship slot and a waiting list of agencies wanting a Fellow.
